Disciplinary Form

The Montessori School strives to encourage the child's inner discipline. This is accomplished by establishing a structured and orderly environment that teaches respect for others. By allowing the child to take responsibility for making their own choices and by accepting the consequences of their behavior, inner discipline is established in these early years for life.

Assertive discipline is used to help the children gain control of themselves. Rules are stated clearly to set guidelines for behavior. A child will be asked to sit in a time-out seat for a short period to separate the child from the undesirable behavior. The child will be able to observe other class members making positive choices for themselves.

Conferences will be called to discuss continuing negative behavior, otherwise problems will be dealt with at school.
