Most of you know that a huge part of the Montessori philosophy is allowing a child to work independently in the tasks that are presented to them. When we allow them to work independently it gives them the freedom to accomplish a task on their own, growing not only in knowledge of basic skills but also confidence in themselves.

Here are just a few tasks that we are allowing your child to accomplish independently;

Putting on their socks and shoes

Putting on their jackets

Folding their blankets “making their beds”

Cleaning up meal messes

Prepping for meals

Anytime a child accomplishes a task on their own I see an immediate excitement and pride in themselves “I did it!” they shout, and they seek to find other things they can do for themselves.

The classroom isn't the only place where they can build on independence, but you can give them the opportunity at home as well. So I encourage you to allow your child the freedom to work on some of the above tasks independently.

I always tell the kiddos that they CAN and they are capable of SO much!
